0.Opening

K.Torlegard, President of ISPRS welcomed all Council members, seven Commission Presidents as well as the four observers at 14:00p.m. on September 21, 1990.

1. Review of Commission and WG Activities

Summary of the seven symposia with respect to the main theme, number of participants and number of presented papers is shown in appendix B.

There were some working groups of which working group chairmen were replaced by other persons as shown in Appendix C.

2.Plans for Next Two Years

Each commission president reported the future plans of WG Workshops up to Washington ISPRS Congress in 1992. The plans of WG workshop is shown in Appendix D.

3.Congress Preparation

Each commission president presented a proposal of required number of sessions with the titles which makes 108 sessions in total though only 70 sessions and 7 special sessions are available at Washington Congress.

After serious discussions and negotiations between Congress Director, Council and Commission Presidents as well as among Commission Presidents, L.Fritz, Congress Director proposed 69 sessions with one vacancy and 7 special sessions with the titles. Allocation of number of sessions is shown in Appendix E.

L.Fritz confirmed the process till Washington Congress which is shown in Appendix G.

4.Report of Ad-hoc Committee on Statutes and Bylaws

J.Trinder, Chairman of Ad-hoc Committee explained the background of the Committee and presented some highlight points of Position Paper. The highlights are 1)to improve the Mission Statement of ISPRS and Terms of Reference of Technical Commissions in order to meet the requirements of GIS and machine vision, 2)to enable multiple national member organizations to apply for ordinary membership and 3)to organize joint congresses every two years instead of the current seven mid-term symposia in different countries.

K.Torlegard, President invited Commission Presidents to present their input for consideration by Council.

4.1 Mission and Terms of Reference

F.Hegyi, Com.VII President, expressed that GIS is apparently handled in ISPRS, but it should be clarified which parts of GIS should be included in ISPRS.

A.Gruen, Com.V President made a comment that ISPRS treats mainly data acquisition, data processiong, data interpretation and data representation through imagery form. He suggested that ISPRS should identify the role of ISPRS in GIS.

K.Szangolies, Com.II President mentioned that photogrammetry and remote sensing is a science of data acquisition, theory, application etc, so that ISPRS should concentrate in the science, particularly to meet computer technology.

Li Deren, Com.III President expressed his view that ISPRS is based on digital image data and spatial information including GIS.

T.Hirai, Com.IV President pointed that application of GIS is so important that an integrated system should be established in cooperation with other societies. J.Badekas, Com.VI President suggested that ISPRS should stay in mapping science including GIS.

The meeting adopted a proposal by A.Gruen that Ad-hoc Committee on Restructure of Technical Commissions should be established until 1992 Washington Congress.

The following three persons were selected as members.

A.Gruen ; Chairman I.Katzarski F.Hegyi

The main tasks of Ad-hoc Committee are to review the terms of reference and to make a proposition of the restructure of technical commissions.

4.2 Multiple Membership

Many opinions for and against multiple membership were presented but the meeting did not reach a conclusion. However, the meeting recognized that ISPRS should be open to any person who is interested in photogrammetry, remote sensing, GIS and machine vision. The meeting also recognized that it is a key point to collect better papers and more people in ISPRS events.

4.3 Joint Symposia

A majority of participants did not agree the congresses to be held every two years. However the meeting recognized that some commission symposia could be merged.

J.Trinder suggested that Com.IV and Com.VII could be merged into one symposium at mid-term.

M.Barbosa suggested that Com.I and Com.II could be also merged into one symposium.

5.1 Archives

S.Murai, Secretary General requested Commission Présidents to report him the availability of proceedings of mid-term symposia with respect to

5.2 Official Journal

J.Hothmer, Editor in Chief of ISPRS Journal reported the recent activity of editing committee as follows.

1)Mrs. D.J.Bethel will be responsible for Book Review

2)Number of subscribers has decreased 25 per cent in these five years.

3)A special discount(50 % reduction) rate, 86.5 US Dollars is available for individuals who are members of national societies affiliated to ISPRS.

J.Hothmer proposed that new contract of publisher with ELSEVIER should be reconsidered and then ISPRS should negotiate with some other publishers under a newly specified "Requirements for a Publisher" drafted by J.Hothmer.

K.Atkinson proposed that ISPRS could be a Publisher herself. But there were many oppositions.

K.Torlegard requested all members test votes after long discussion whether ISPRS request bids from other publishers or not. The meeting decided that ISPRS should request bids from Wichmann,Springer, Taylor & Francis, de Gruyter and Cambridge University Press within three months. The draft of "Requirements for a Publisher" will be immedietly corrected or modified by K.Torlegard and K.Atkinson.

6.Report of IUSM

K.Torlegard reported the activities of Executive Board and Council Meeting of IUSM which was held in June, 1990 in Helsinki, Finland including IUSM's Statutes, WG's on GPS, education and GIS. He reported that ISPRS is responsible for WG on GPS.

The meeting selected the four voting members in addition to two Executive Board members as follows.
