0. Opening

K. Torlegard welcomed all ISPRS officers for comming to the meeting.

1. Approval of Agenda

The agenda was approved.

2. Review of the Minutes of Previous Meeting

The minute were approved.

3. Preparatin of the 17th ISPRS Congressa

a. Congress Director's Report

L.Fritz reported the statistics of the abstracts with respect to Commission, country, author and categories. It was suggested that the name of TAIWAN should be changed to CHINA TAIPEI. USSR will be changed for moment RUSSIA or CIS(Commonwealth of Independent States). Secretary General should ask the former USSR to report the new name of the country and the society.

L.Fritz suggested Cormmission Presidents review the to proposal of technical sessions and poster program sessions to finalize the well-prepared program. Concerning the poster session. there will be three hours for display and another

hour and a half for oral presentation. It was agreed that all reserved papers should be moved to the poster papers in the final program.

After the discussion about the rule to confirm the speakers at technical session and the poster presenters, it was agreed that the commission presidents should confirm whether the speakers will attend the Congress or not. If the confirmation does not reach Congress Director by May 15, 1992, the speakers, the poster presenters as well as the papers would be deleted from the final program and the proceedings respectively.

Session chairmen shall be responsible for the session report, of which the guiding rule and procedure will be provided by Congress Director. It was suggested that the session reports should be submitted to Congress Director under the control of Commission Presidents during the Congress.

8. IUSM

K. Torlegard explained also about the admission of membership in which two categories of principal and affliated members are specified under the guideline. The members of the executive board representing ISPRS are K. Torlegard and G. Konecny. The voting members are S. Murai, A. Gruen, L.Fritz and F. Hegyi at Washington Congress. A. Gruen made a comment on the Automated Control System whether IUSM is proper organization or not because SPIE for example is already concerned with the subject.

ISPRS officers were invited to the Scottish Exhibition and Conference Centre for consideration of possibility to host 1996 ISPRS Congress at 1:30-2:30pm on March 24, 1992.

9. CIPA

K. Torlegard explained the recent progress of CIPA. CIPA is the joint organization of ICOMOS (Internationa Council on Monuments and Sites) and ISPRS. CIPA requested ISPRS to ratify the new version of Statutes. A Gruen served as a member of the adhoc committee on the Statutes.

A.Gruen reviewed the draft of the Statutes and received comments from the ISPRS officers. With a slight correction of wording, the revised version was ratified by the ISPRS officers. S.Murai, Secretary General should reply Prof. M. Fondelli that ISPRS has ratified the corrected version of the Statutes, which A. Gruen should retype and mail to the Secretary General.

b. Length of the Congress

As the two-weeks congress has been critisized in its length by many people, K.Torlegard proposed the discussion amongst the ISPRS officers. Free discussion was made.

K.Szangolis memtioned from the manufacturer's view, 10 days would be maximum. G.Konecny suggested a compromise that the opening of exhibition may be organized from not the begining day of congress.

- L. Fritz also commented that two weeks are too long for exhibition. But it must be considered that the ISPRS congress is organized every four years.
- J. Trinder said that if the concurrent sessions increase from three to more, the duration may be shortened. But there will be more papers in future. The meeting showed the afraid that the archive will increase the volume with more that 2,000 papers in near future. A lot of opinions were exchanged about the quality of archive and the number of papers to be accepted for printing. It was concluded that the quality should be maintained but there should be no limit for papers.

d. CEOS

G. Konecny reported the history of working group on International Satellite for Mapping, and the present status of CEOS, of which members are limited to governmental agencies, national space agencies and international organizations, that is, political group rather than scientific group. G.Konecny expressed his opinion that CEOS should be open for scientific body like ISPRS. It was discussed the possibility of ISPRS contribution to CEOS, for example as observer's status, or scientific advisor.

e. Report of Commission Activity to ISPRS official journal

J. Trinder requested TCP to report the result of the Congress and achievement of activity to the ISPRS journals by September 1, 1992 after the Congress. The incomming TCP's should also submit the future idea of organizing the Commissions.
